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Goods and Services

It is important to understand that whatever you buy is either a good or a service:


GOODS: items that can be touched with one's hands

ex- a skateboard can be touched by your hands



SERVICE: this is a job that you can pay someone else to do

ex- car wash is a service because others are paid to do it



Examples



- 1. Car- it is a <u>good</u> since it can be touched
 - 2. Housekeeping- it is a service because people are paid to do it
- 3. Toys- these are <u>goods</u>
 because you can touch them
 with your hands
 - 4. Babysitting- this is a <u>service</u> because those who do it are paid for it

Let's Get a Grasp:

The government is created in order to keep its citizens safe



Additionally, it helps people work <u>together</u>



The government does so by making <u>laws</u>

• Laws- rules that the government creates in order to keep people

safe and help them work together



Examples: laws that sound familiar

- Cannot cross the road when the light is red
- Drive at the speed limit and not faster than it
- Never steal things

Following the Rules

The government ensures that people follow the laws through:

 Police Officers—these are individuals who make sure that citizens follow the laws and arrest people who do not

The Court System:

 Helps to decide <u>if</u> a person has broken the law + what the punishment should be

 Countries have distinct court systems that deal w/ different cases





The Main Idea

Continents are large masses of land:

- The world has <u>seven</u> continents- Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Australia, and Europe
- North America: this continent consists of major biomes (deserts, grasslands, forests, etc.)
- South America: this is the 4th largest continent, with Brazil being the biggest country there.
 South America also has the Amazon River
- Europe: it is the second smallest continent and 80% used to be covered in forests
- Africa: this is the second largest continent and has 54 countries total
- <u>Asia:</u> over 42 billion people live there and it is the largest continent

- * <u>Australia:</u> this continent only consits of one country and also is the home to various types of animals
- <u>Antarctica:</u> this is the least populated continent and it is fully covered in ice




Each continent holds its diverse history, culture, etc. They allow for communication between people and help us to understand Earth's geology!

What is Currency?

Currency is the system of money used in a country:

 Dollar- this currency is used by the United States, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand

 Euro- this currency is used by countries in the European Union



 Yen- the yen is Japan's currency and it is the most traded of Asian currencies Pound- The Great British Pound/pound sterling,
 is the official currency of the United Kingdom



Rupee- this currency is official currency
 of India and is also used by Pakistan

 Currencies help to determine the economic wealth of a country!



Additional Currencies


 Peso- used by countries in the Americans and Philippines
